Lamont chaired the State Investment Advisory Council, was a member of the Board of Estimate and Taxation and held the position of selectman for the Town of Greenwich. This fall, Lamont is setting up a policy institute in Connecticut.

Lamont graduated magna cum laude from Harvard College with a B.A. in sociology. He earned a master's degree in public/private management and an advanced degree in finance from the Yale School of Management. Lamont is a native of Long Island, N.Y. and a 30-year resident of Greenwich, Conn.

Cowell, said, "Ned's entrepreneurial experience, extensive political connections and leadership in influencing public policy will be a tremendous asset to CSG. We are proud to have Ned on board and we look forward to working with him as we continue to grow our company."
