ELIZABETH WEINER NAMED NEW YORK CITY DIRECTOR  
FOR CONSERVATION SERVICES GROUP

WESTBOROUGH, Mass., Nov. 29, 2007 – Conservation Services Group (CSG) today announced Elizabeth R. Weiner as New York City program development director, according to Mark Dyen, senior vice president. In this newly created position, Weiner is responsible for policy, business development and ensuring coordination of CSG’s relationships among city, state and utility groups.

Prior to joining CSG, Weiner spent more than 20 years with BusinessWeek in top level editorial positions at both the U.S. and international editions of the magazine. Most recently, as a senior editor of the domestic edition, she was responsible for coverage by senior reporters on a wide range of topics, from international business affairs, to social issues. At the international edition, Weiner specialized in business and economic coverage of Latin America, South Africa and Europe. Before joining BusinessWeek, Weiner was a freelance writer and managing editor at The Villager in New York City.

Fluent in Spanish, Weiner also taught English as a second language in Mexico. Weiner began her career as director of the Governor’s Committee on Children and Youth in Trenton, N.J. There, she was successful in reviving dormant committee and legislative interest in juvenile justice issues. Two years later, she became a co-director of Horizon House in Milwaukee, Wisc., where she was responsible for grant writing and served as the liaison with the board of directors and law enforcement. After moving to New York City, she worked as a researcher at the then-International Ladies Garment Workers Union (predecessor to today’s UNITE HERE) focusing on trade and immigration issues.

Dyen said, “Liz’s distinguished career in management, journalism and international business affairs will greatly benefit CSG as we expand our services in New York City. Her extensive experience in working with agencies, government officials and other important constituencies is also a major asset and we are pleased to have her on our staff.”
